## OFMC-Funded Justice Complexes Underway in South Dakota and New Mexico

An April ground breaking at Pine Ridge began construction of the OFMC-funded justice complex for the Oglala Sioux Tribe; a similar complex for the Navajo Nation is well underway in Crownpoint, N.M.

As authorized by Congress, OFMC is funding part of the construction of the Crownpoint Justice center in New Mexico and a court and law enforcement office adjoining the Oglala Sioux Tribal Offenders Facility in Pine Ridge, S.D.

The 112,000 square foot Crownpoint project will include space for a district court, corrections, law enforcement, probation, peacemaking program, prosecutors and public defenders.

The 94,000 square foot addition to the detention center in Pine Ridge began with an April 2012 ground-breaking. It will rise next to the 54,360 square foot tribal detention center, which has 150 beds.
