

Q: Who do I contact if I want to extend my lease?

A: Indian Landowners, at their discretion, may enter into lease agreements or extend existing lease agreements. The Bureau of Indian Affairs does not compel landowners to enter into new leases or extend existing leases.

If you want to extend your residential sublease you should first contact the lessor from whom you leased your land.

If you lease directly from an Indian landowner you may submit your request for a lease extension directly to the landowner or their representative.
