Dear Tribal Leader:

Although the lapse in Federal appropriations prevented us from holding consultations in January, I remain committed to scheduling sessions in Bethel and Kotzebue, Alaska, to hear your comments on the Department of the Interior's (Interior) implementation of the Alaska IRA and the authority to take land into trust in Alaska. I hope you will attend at one of the following sessions rescheduled in March.

The topics of the consultation sessions are the same as previously announced in the July 2, 2018 letter. The morning sessions will be devoted to discussing Interior's implementation of the 1936 amendment to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934¹ (IRA), known as the Alaska IRA.² The afternoon sessions will address the Secretary of the Interior's exercise of authority to take land into trust in Alaska and issues left unresolved by the Solicitor's Opinion M-37043.
