

Wildfire Prevention Plan – Table 11, Community Actions, Example

This is an example of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Wildfire Prevention Plan, Table 11, Community Actions. It is provided as the example, described in the BIA's Wildfire Prevention Handbook, on page twenty-two. This table tracks the planned activities at the community level. They are similar to those planned for Specific Actions, and General Actions, but are planned in a specific community. The first spreadsheet is a summary sheet, that automatically sums up the activities from the individual communities into one, overall Community Actions Table. In this example, seven communities are used, to illustrate the functionality of the table. All tables have fictitious data, to demonstrate how Table 11 should appear in a prevention plan.
